


Polarization Surges Among the Politically Engaged


Distribution of Democrats and Republicans on a 10-item scale of political values, by level of political engagement


Among the politically engaged



Among the less engaged









Republicans Shift to the Right, Democrats to the Left


Distribution of Republicans and Democrats on a 10-item scale of political values









My own faith crisis

- Crisis began as harmless exploration, followed by realization...


Church art is totally bizarre

 - Flame wars/exceeding rudeness

The Function of Identity

What does identity do for us?

"Identity provides a deep sense of ideological commitment and allows the individual to know his or her place in the world. It provides one with a sense of well-being, a sense of being at home in one's body, a sense of direction in one's life, and a sense of mattering to those who count. Identity is what makes one move with direction; it is what gives one reason to be."

Faith Crisis: Identity Disruption

Often brought about through a new awareness of conflicting information regarding beliefs and/or a discrepancy between expectations of ambassadors of faith (leaders and members but mostly leaders) and perceived or actual behavior of those ambassadors.

Faith Crisis : Range of experience

Rapid/Violent Crisis of Faith

Often precipitated by: CES Letter, Mormonthink.com. New Atheist books/speeches, Enhanced Gospel Topics essays, Prop 8 actions, City Creek Mall and other real estate investments

Slow (supported) Crisis of Faith

Student of history, scripture, or religion in general; perhaps also long time subscribers of Sunstone and Dialogue

Faith Crisis : Online Expressions of Faith or Doubt Receives Mixed Responses

Why? Why don't people get us? Why do even those with similar conclusions respond so differently?

Why are some told (i)'they have been reading anti-mormon literature' (ii) they haven't read deeply enough, or (iii) they have/had the wrong expectations?

Identity Development

Crisis: "In a developmental sense [connotes] not a threat of catastrophe, but a turning point, a crucial period of increased vulnerability and heightened potential."

"I shall present human growth from the point of view of the conflicts, inner and outer, which the vital personality weathers, re-emerging from each crisis with an increased sense of inner unity, with an increase of good judgement, and an increase in the capacity to do well according to [the individual's] own standards and to the standards of those who are significant to [them]."

Who am I and what is my place in the world?

What does the ideal 24 year-old Mormon believe and how do they behave?

- a. thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent
- b. believes in God
- c. believes in intervention via priesthood and via spirit
- d. believes the bible and BOM are God's word
- e. believes prophets since Joseph have a special connection to God (were/are likely visited by God) and they give god's teachings to us
- f. believes in a divine historical narrative.
- g. believes prayer can be and has been answered by God

Identity-Forming Events are Not Always Ideal

- Reading the BOM and Bible
- Spiritual experiences in church
- Interactions with leaders
- Serving a proselyting mission
- Marriage in temple
- Parents/youth leaders views of the church

Identity Disruption (Faith Crisis)

It causes one to seriously question one's:

- essential personality traits or character
- view of oneself
- perceived view of others
- meaning and purpose of existence

It Is All About Belief

"... recognizing our errors is such a strange experience: accustomed to disagreeing with other people, we suddenly find ourselves at odds with ourselves. Error, in that moment, is less an intellectual than an existential one—crisis not in what we know but who we are. We hear something of that identity crisis in the questions we ask ourselves in the aftermath of error: What was I thinking? How could I have done that?"

". . . [errors] represent a moment of alienation, both from ourselves and from a previously convincing vision of the world."

People who Disagree with Us

(1) ignorance, (2) idiocy or incompetence, (3) evil

"These tendencies are most troubling for the way they fuel animosity and conflict. But they are also troubling because they make it extremely difficult to accept our own fallibility. If we assume that people who are 'wrong' are ignorant, or idiotic, or evil—well, small wonder that we prefer not to confront the possibility of error in ourselves."

Online Communication: Pleasures and Pains

- We are not limited to our local community
 - We can find people who think like us!
